Too dangerous on the farm for a deaf dog with not able to hear tractors, bikes, cars, trucks, then there are the sheep and cattle, so we are trying to rehome her. Will need a home which is well fenced and with patient owners to teach her sign language. Might have someone in the wings which is great.

Meantime we are enjoying this little frisky darling. Ayla loves her but has learnt to put her arms over her face to stop the licking!
