Such a difference. We are having a hot summer so far! Not much rain either. Hope we get some tomorrow/Monday. My tomatoes don't like the heat in the hot house at all!

I was in Palmy yesterday looking after Ollie. He is so easy to care for. He toddles around and has a sign for please – that he uses often!!!! Lets me know if he doesn't want something as well!

Am going over to weed one of Liv's raised garden beds this morning. They are away for the weekend. Her partner Jymahl's brother Nathan is a diplomat and is being posted to Switzerland in two weeks, so they are having a big family get-together out at the coast. Will let her two dogs off whilst I am gardening. She has such long days, that gardening isn't on the agenda and boy, it has got away. Hope to do a bit of gardening here as well and maybe mow the lawns. They usually do them, but that hasn't happened either – mainly white daisies!

Jymahl has had a very trying two weeks, starting just before Christmas. Jymahl is sole charge sergeant at Eketahuna Police. First was a suicide from a man from out of town who had recently moved a house onto some land. Then the next day, there was a fatal road accident in the district which killed a long time Eketahuna resident. Then NY day another suicide of an 18-year-old who we had known since he was little. Since that suicide the town has been holding meetings of families of young ones to make sure they are all OK. This weekend away will be great for Jymahl.

They are staying at a farm on which the land runs down to the beach. It is idyllic. Glenburn Station is the name. Anyway, there are 30 of them out there from both sides of his family.

Glad the bulbs are starting to appear, always brings joy I think. My dahlias are a picture and have a few new ones in. 3 are a dark nearly red/black.

OK. Time to really start the day.
